
A Time of Renewal

This past year has been one of grounding ourselves in a changed world following three years of the COVID-19 pandemic. Despite the end of the public health emergency in May, systemic challenges persist in our communities. Our healthcare system remains fragile, with a decreased workforce available to address critical care needs. Residents face increasing economic pressures, with inflation and the loss of enhanced pandemic supports. Social isolation and loneliness have reached epidemic proportions. As a society, we need to find our collective footing and forge new, perhaps even better, paths.

Our team supports older adults, people with disabilities, veterans, and family caregivers to live their best lives. We are identifying new strategies to address the challenges individuals face each day, and reassessing and reprioritizing to achieve improved outcomes.

- We are investing in programs that address social care needs. We
 have allocated funding to enhance linguistic and technology access
 and provided funding to community partners for new and expanded
 programs addressing housing instability and mental health.
- We've reaffirmed our commitment to equity by piloting a program of cultural home-delivered meals and re-engaged with community partners to expand social programs for LGBTQIA+ older adults.
- Our office relocated to Burlington, returning to the community that was Minuteman's home for over twenty years.
- We are redesigning our logo, messaging, and website. This reflects input of nearly 200 stakeholders, internal and external, to build on our strengths and ease access to information for those seeking our services. Stay tuned for more in the coming months!


We offer information and supportive services that enhance health, well-being, and independence.

Support for Essential Needs

Many Massachusetts residents enrolled in MassHealth will need to take action to continue health insurance coverage, as annual MassHealth renewals had been put on hold during the pandemic. Thanks to support from the Massachusetts Executive Office of Elder Affairs and MassHealth, Aging Services Access Points like Minuteman have received additional funding to assist consumers in renewing MassHealth or applying for SNAP benefits.

Our new Benefit Support Specialist, trained by MassHealth, can help with benefit eligibility information, completing applications for any COVID-19 pandemic-related program or service, and assisting consumers in understanding health benefit programs and services that may be changing or ending. For those no longer eligible for MassHealth, the Benefit Support Specialist is available to help find alternative health insurance and complete applications.

Funding is provided through the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Public Health Workforce Funds through the Administration for Community Living (ACL).

Good Food

Good nutrition is essential to good health, and we are continually making improvements to our Senior Nutrition program. This year, we shifted our meal program to a new kitchen within the area we serve, resulting in improved meal quality and efficiency of delivery. We added a hearthealthy, carbohydrate-controlled option for Meals on Wheels recipients who qualify, and we are piloting a vegetarian/Indian meal option as well.

The Change of Condition mobile application that we developed continues to allow for quick identification of potential health and safety concerns among our homebound Meals on Wheels consumers and improved communication and intervention among care teams. And we are proud to announce that the app has now been adapted for use by three Meals on Wheels programs in Massachusetts.

Our partnership with the Bedford VA Healthcare System enabled a veteran at risk of losing his housing to obtain immediate assistance. Sam needed a Representative Payee in order to receive his social security payments. (The Rep Payee program provides benefit payment management for beneficiaries not able to manage their Social Security or Supplemental Security Income (SSI) payments.) When Sam's previous Rep Payee passed away, these checks were held back until another could be found. Our Money Management staff jumped into action, taking on this role and working with Sam's social worker to submit the needed paperwork, set up a new bank account, pay his back rent, and free up funds to pay for food, prescriptions, and other essentials.

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
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Help with Life's Little Necessities

For over 25 years, the Little Necessities Program has been supporting our efforts to help older women maintain their independence by providing for needs for which there is no other funding source. The Fund is managed by the Katharine C. Pierce Trust, Bank of America, N.A., Co-Trustee. Its purpose, as written in the 1912 governing instrument, is to "assist needy and deserving gentlewomen, in reduced circumstances, so that their lives may be made more comfortable."

This program gives Care Managers access to grants to help older women live safely and comfortably. A little necessity might be a microwave for someone unable to use a stove; a railing in the hallway to prevent falls; an air conditioner to prevent asthmatic attacks; payments towards chore service to clean up an apartment that has deteriorated; a security deposit needed to secure a new apartment; a mattress for someone who has been sleeping on the floor.

Minuteman assists approximately 30 women each year through this essential program.
