



Consumer Directed Care (CDC) Program

What is the CDC program?

CDC is a service delivery model within the State Home Care Program that allows consumers to exert greater control over the provision of personal assistance services.

How does the CDC program work?

The program was intended for consumers who meet State Home Care eligibility to be able to recruit, hire, and schedule their own care with their own chosen caregivers rather than using a traditional provider. ASAPs help facilitate the program in partnership with a financial intermediary.

Who qualifies for the CDC program?

- Consumers who are financially and clinically eligible for State Home Care Services
- Consumers who are not enrolled in the Frail Elder Waiver
- Consumers who can manage the program on their own or have an identified surrogate who can manage the program for them

What can my worker do?

Consumers can instruct their workers to perform any personal assistance services they need, including Homemaking, Companion, Chore, Personal Care, Transportation, and help with Medication Management.

Who can be my worker?

Consumers may hire one or more workers, as necessary, to meet their needs. Workers may be family members, friends, or neighbors. Workers cannot be a spouse or legally responsible relative. A worker must be legally authorized to work in the United States.
